

Survey: Parents in Special Needs Project

- Partnership with CUPW Special Needs Project
- 483 parents members with children with disabilities
- Health information questionnaire part of spring Advisor phone interview
- Target Audience Project provided data analysis
- Project development information for Special Needs Project

Where do members in the Special Needs Project live?



Survey: Parents in Special Needs Project

What did parents say?

- Parents use and prefer multiple formats of health information....on average 3.
- Used and preferred formats are the same across ages of child and parts of the country.
 - 1. Personal contact with a health professional
 - 2. Website/internet
 - 3. Articles

Survey: Parents in Special Needs Project

What did parents say?

- Health concerns during past year
 - **→** Emotional health
 - **♦** Social behaviour
 - → Intellectual development
 - → Nutrition
- Looking for health information
 - → Emotional health
 - Social behaviour
 - **→**nutrition

What did focus group participants say?

- Health and Learning Issues

 - **→ Physical activity**

Issue: Nutrition



- Food security
- → Geography
- **→** Time
- Emotional aspects
- Practices in early learning settings
- **→** Food allergies

Issue: Physical Activity



- Physical development
- Obesity
- Outdoor activities in winter
- Activity levels in early learning settings: children, staff and students

Issue: Environment



- **→** Water
- Air quality
- **→** Pesticides
- + Food additives
- **+**Toxins
- **+** Asthma

Issue: Illness and illness prevention



- **→ Immunizations**
- **♦ Communicable** diseases
- → Dental health
- → "half well"
- + Handwashing
- Antibiotic resistance

Issue: Social/Emotional Health



- **→ Family stress**
- **→** Poverty
- **→ Immigrant** families
- → Impact of illness
- → Pain and grief

Sources and formats of information

- **→ Internet**
- Medical personnel
- Health clinics
- + Friends, family, colleagues
- **+**Library
- + Health line (telehealth)
- Print materials
- Support groups

Barriers to access

- Lack of access to health professionals
- Lack of skills to find and determine reliability and validity of internet information
- **→ Insufficient rural and northern connectivity**
- Low levels of literacy
- Cultural and language differences

Information gaps and needs

- Need for more information in areas such as:
 - Alternative health
 - **→** Emotional wellness
 - Learning disabilities and autism
- The huge health promotion "machine"

Service gaps and needs

- Lack of family physicians
- → Public health nurses need more time
- More speech and language services are needed
- Hearing screening and allergy testing
- More dieticians
- Support for transportation
- Trained early childhood workforce

Target Audience Project: Key Findings

- → Relationship as "key"
- Income as a determinant of health
- Mixed messages
- Health literacy
- Communities and context matter

Target Audience Project: Complexities

- Financial factors
- Safety factors
- **→** Emotional factors
- Cultural factors
- **→**People factors

Identified Barriers

- Lack of health professionals
- → Skills to find and determine reliability/validity of internet information
- Rural and northern isolation
- Low levels of health literacy
- Cultural and language differences

Identified Service Needs

More:

- Family physicians
- Time for Public health nurses
- Speech and language services
- Hearing screening/allergy testing
- → Dieticians
- Transportation support
- Trained early childhood workforce
- Quality child care spaces

Future Directions and Connections

- Knowledge exchange
- Lessons in Learning
 - "Mixed Messages"
- Forum to action: other HLKC work groups
 - Health affected by social barriers
 - Relationships with health professionals
 - Health literacy
- → Research on working relationships of public health nurses and high priority families in northern communities (UNBC and Northern Health)
