What is "MOVE?"

- Mobility Opportunities Via Education
- An international program for children with severe disabilities to acquire increased independence to sit, stand and walk.
- Merger of Therapy and Education

How Did MOVE Begin?

- Linda Bidabe a special education teacher for the Superintendent of Schools, Bakersfield, CA.
- 1986 Pilot Program that? Why students with severe disabilities were regressing and leaving school with less skills than when they entered.



What is the MOVE Philosophy?

- All children learn—no matter how severe the disability.
- All children learn if we know how to teach.
- All children can improve their motor skills if given enough physical assistance.
- All children must be given the opportunity to learn motor skills.

What is the MOVE Philosophy?

- Children with severe disabilities will reach the level of our expectations.
- Impossible is an option not fact!



How Widespread is MOVE?

- The MOVE Program is used in 30 countries
- United Kingdom, Europe MiddleEast, Japan, China South America, Australia
- The MOVE Curriculum is translated into 11 languages

Is There A Book?

- The MOVE curriculum provides a framework and method to measure the learning of vital skills in sitting, standing and walking.
- The MOVE curriculum allows for easy documentation, goal writing, task analysis and measures skills not easy measured.

How MOVE Works—Six Steps

- 1. Testing
- 2. Setting Goals
- 3. Task Analysis
- 4. Measuring Prompts
- 5. Prompt Reduction Plan
- 6. Teaching the Skills

What MOVE Is—

- A philosophy
- Functional, useful, measurable progress for setting life goals
- A collaborative effort between families and professionals—"It takes a team to MOVE"
- A program for people with a singular disability to complex disabilities
- A program that changes ways of thinking, changes attitudes and promotes inclusive living

- A Structured program based in assessment and accountability
- A top down approach to help develop skills beyond the highest skills an individual already possesses
- A way of life used throughout the day, used anywhere in an activity
- Embedded in existing curricula and activities
- Cost-efficient and effective

What MOVE Is Not—

- A cure
- A developmental, bottom-up model
- A pull-out, standalone program

- Seeking to replace other services
- Solely a therapy
- An equipment-based program
- A meaningless "exercise" program

What About Equipment?

 Equipment is viewed as temporary.... Not a permanent substitute for skills a person lacks.

 Dependence on equipment is continually reduced until as much independence is achieved as possible.

Equipment is used to "do what?"

 Different equipment for different functional and educational activities.

Basic Provider Training

- 4 day course for teachers, therapists, and other professionals in the disability field to learn how to teach the MOVE Basic Provider training to people within their local employment bases.
- Both courses taught each year in June at MOVE International – Bakersfield, California
